Craig Cawrse is a Landscape Architect, who does Landscape Planning that utilizes Sustainable components that are friendly to the environment, using Permeable Pavement, Rain Gardens, Bio-Swales, and Bio-Retention Basins.

He presented a Power Point of his recently designed and built new Headquarters Building in Chagrin Falls, Ohio. Utilizing the above mentioned techniques he was awarded the “2007 Smart Growth Association Award.” His Project Goals for the new building site were to:

- 1. Reduce storm water runoff from new construction.***
- 2. Design an office site that would protect and embellish the property by utilizing a detailed storm water management system while conserving the surrounding vegetation and open space.***
- 3. Assure water quality.***
- 4. Reduce runoff.***
- 5. Stream preservation.***

ASSE Releases a White Paper to Address Scald Hazards Associated with Low-Flow Showerheads

Westlake, Ohio, October 1, 2010 — The American Society of Sanitary Engineering has released a white paper intended to bring attention to safety hazards associated with low-flow showerheads when used in conjunction with non-automatic compensating type shower valves. “Scald Hazards Associated with Low-Flow Showerheads: A White Paper” was developed by the American Society of Sanitary Engineering Scald Awareness Task Group; a group comprised of 24 individual professionals who have dedicated their time and expertise to this potentially lifesaving awareness effort.

In recent years, there have been various water conservation programs promoting the use of water saving products, such as low-flow showerheads. Safety and water conservation are both extremely important to ASSE; however, safety becomes the priority when dealing with the threat of scald-burns and thermal shock injuries caused by low-flow showerheads used in conjunction with non-automatic compensating type shower valves. The user of a non-automatic compensating type shower or tub/shower valve could, without warning, be exposed to extreme variations in water temperatures, either cold or hot, when a low-flow showerhead is installed in the shower.

In support of the Society’s motto, “Prevention Rather Than Cure,” this white paper is issued with the goal of preventing serious scald-related injuries, rather than deal with these injuries after the pain and damage has already been inflicted. “Scald Hazards Associated with Low-Flow Showerheads: A White Paper” covers the problems and hazards of using low-flow showerheads with non-automatic compensating type shower valves, examples of these problems, solutions to these problems, illustrative tables and graphs, statistics, and associated definitions.

ASSE Calls for Scald Awareness Task Group Participants A Task Group to Raise Awareness of Harmful Scalding Issues

Westlake, Ohio, December 10, 2010 — The American Society of Sanitary Engineering's Scald Awareness Task Group is currently seeking new members to participate in the creation of their second white paper. This group carries the important purpose of raising awareness about the disfiguring and painful problems of scalding caused by improper or inadequate plumbing systems. The first white paper published by this group dealt with scald hazards associated with low-flow showerheads.

For their second white paper, the Scald Awareness Task Group hopes to raise awareness about issues relating to improper temperature settings for residential water heaters. Currently, there is a common misconception that the thermostat on residential water heaters should be used to control the final temperature at the tap or shower. This group hopes to inform the public of scalding issues and potential Legionella exposure when residential water heater thermostats are not set at the proper temperature.

Through the research and knowledge of its volunteers, the Scald Awareness Task Group intends to explain why a water heater's thermostat should not control final water temperature and what happens when this practice is employed. The white paper will also include recommendations on how to properly control final water temperature.

This task group is currently open to any interested party. All of those interested in participating must complete an "Application for Committee/Working Group Membership" (http://www.asse-plumbing.org/standards/Working_Group_App.pdf) and submit the completed application to Richard J. Prospal, Chairman of the Scald Awareness Task Group, via e-mail at: RJProspal@asse-plumbing.org. All applications must be received no later than January 12, 2011. The first meeting of this group is scheduled for January 19, 2011 at 2:00pm EST. All meetings will be conducted via WebEx conference call and will be limited to one hour per session.

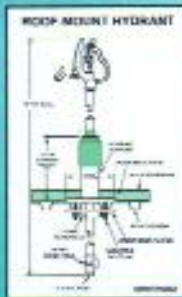
