



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
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# <u>Residential Plumbing Code Questions</u> <u>State of Illinois Plumbing Code</u>

- 1. Who owns the Illinois Plumbing Code?
  - a. The Illinois Complied Statute Department
  - b. The Illinois Department of Administrative Rule
  - c. The Joint Commission of Administrative Rule
  - d. The Illinois Department of Public Health Water Quality Plumbing Program
- 2. If you have a disagreement with the local code official. Can the State overrule the local code official's decisions?
  - a. Yes. the State Inspectors is a Certified Inspector for the State and can overrule the Local Inspector
  - b. No. The local code official is the Authority Having jurisdiction (AHJ). The State has no authority to overrule the AHJ.



The arrows below indicate where cleanouts should be. Why? Because all three of these are considered drains. And you cannot use the p-trap for a clean out per 890.430. There is more than one 90°.

In Addition to: 890.420 i) Cleanouts shall be of the same size as the pipe they serve up to a maximum of 6 inches, and at least 6 inches for larger pipe. The pipe being served is 2" and 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". The 2" and the 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " clean outs under the sink shall be a two way clean out



Proper installation of a vacuum relief valve is code compliant. Where is this in the State of Illinois Code book? 890.1230 f.

Vacuum Relief Valve. If a hot water storage tank or water heater is located at an elevation above the fixture outlets in the hot water system, or if the storage tank or water heater is bottom fed, a vacuum relief valve as listed in Appendix A.Table A (Approved Standards for Plumbing Appliances/Appurtenances/Devices) shall be installed on the storage tank or heater.

The heater is mounted on the wall above the fixtures and is bottom feed
